Damage to Mt Clear Heritage listed Horse Puddler

Lavery Avenue Mt Clear is host to two Heritage listed mining sites. The Horse Puddler and the Mt Clear mining landscape. Recently a contractor constructed a sewer trench through the western edge of the Horse Puddler as shown in the image below. The FoCC has written a letter of

complaint to the Ballarat Council asking for a full investigation, prosecution for the damage and a professional restitution of the site. Heritage listed features are protected by law.

Tree planting proposal

Proposal for trial planting to link remnant vegetation patches in Canadian Regional Park

<u>Aim</u>: To establish a link of trees between patches of remnant vegetation in the ex-plantation area where there has been little natural regeneration of tree species. This would be a trial to determine future management of the ex-plantation blocks.

<u>Where</u>: 500m x 50m strip, on north side of minor track, between remnant vegetation patch along Dozed Track heading south-east towards remnant vegetation south of Katy Ryans Rd.

<u>Species to be planted:</u> Eucalyptus aromaphloia, dives, radiata, obliqua, baxteri, Acacia mearnsii, melanoxylon,Leptospermum continentales. <u>Method:</u>

 250 plants to be planted at 10m spacing, with weedmat and tree guards. There is a some natural regeneration of shrubs and ground cover in this area. Weeds in this area are few. Is it possible for some weed control to be done by a contractor?
