# **Bunanyung Landscape Alliance**

Over the past months the FoCC, local landcare groups and environmental organisations have been meeting under the auspices of the Natural Resources Conservation League of Victoria (NRCL) with the view to forming a "Landscape Alliance" covering the area south of Ballarat.

The "Bunanyung Landscape Alliance" is the proposed name for the alliance of community members, landcare and

friends groups, networks and associations involved in promoting the health of biodiversity for the urban and rural catchments of the Moorabool, Leigh and Woady Yaloak, all which form the northern part of the Corangamite Catchment Area

Bunanyung is the Wadawurrung spelling for Mt Buninyong and is described as a "man lying on his back with knees raised (from shape of the hill)". Adopting the name Bunanyung recognises the long custodianship of the land by the Wadawurrung people. The name "Landscape Alliance" reflects the current custodianship by the Alliance's members and stakeholders.

By combining the names into the "Bunanyung Landscape Alliance" the past, present and future is expressed and identified.

Bunanyung is a centrally located significant landscape feature within the defined land are of the Bunanyung Landscape Alliance

# <u>Living with Bushfire Community Conference at Federation</u> University

Several FoCC friends attended the bushfire conference on October 6 and 7. The conference covered an incredibly wide range of fire topics.

Most interesting were the sessions on indigenous or cool burning which involves slower and cooler burning of forest fuel. Its purpose is partly cultural in looking after and healing the land as well as burning to create new growth and germinate plants that rely on fire for survival.

Trial burns have been undertaken by the Dja Dja Wurrung Park rangers around Bendigo and the Craigie Forest near Maryborough. One difference is that current fuel reduction burning often burns trees right to the top. Indigenous burning because it is cooler and slower rarely goes above 2 to 3metres. This allows small animals, reptiles and insects to get out of the way. Other indigenous burning trials have been undertaken at Teasdale by the Golden Plains Shire

A trial Indigenous burning is planned for Woowookarung in autumn next year. A lesson from the conference is that Indigenous burning and current fuel reduction practices both have a role in land management.
