
## 2. Bunanyung Landscape Alliance Open House

The Bunanyung Landscape Alliance is holding an open house at Royal Park, Buninyong to discuss and receive feedback about the Alliance draft plan. Details below.





The "Bunanyung Landscape Alliance" is an emerging alliance of community members, Landcare and friends' groups, networks and associations in the urban and rural catchments of the Moorabool, Leigh and Woady Yaloak, all of which form the northern part of the Corangamite Catchment Management Area as shown below.



The Alliance's journey began in early 2017 with an idea and strong support from the Natural Resources Conservation League. After many consultations, the alliances plans are now well into the formative stage.

The mission or purpose of the Bunanyung Landscape Alliance is to be the community's advocate for our environment. In partnership with our stakeholders, we assist in the development and implementation of shared evidence based, visionary landscape – scale projects that protect and /or enhance our land and waterscapes. These projects will reflect the aspirations of our local member groups and our goal of engaging the broader community.


# 4. Drinks at the "Lookout" Saturday December 8<sup>th</sup>.

- And if so was an arborists report undertaken
- As the tree is partly on the footpath and partly on private property why was the tree not protected
