Dementia Trail works begin. Contractors have removed bog holes and have fixed drainage lines along the Dementia trail. A large number of landscaping boulders have been delivered to the fenced off Car Park. Soil from the track has been stored on the corner of Dozed Rd and Katy Ryans Rd.



Weed control: Parks Victoria have funded additional weed control in the Park.

Since establishment, Parks Victoria have spent in the vicinity of \$160000 on weed control and removal. **The Eco Blade** machine has removed large areas of broom and gorse in the last few weeks in areas shown by the red circles on the map below.

6. Gorge water easement ecological repair meeting

A local resident meeting 4pm Thursday April 8th at the Park Entrance on Greenhill Road Mt Helen.

In the coming weeks, Central Highlands Water (CHW), in partnership with Parks Victoria, will engage a contractor to reinstate a water pipe easement in Woowookarung Regional Park, in the area known as 'The Gorge' (please see map overleaf). This water infrastructure supplies drinking water to Buninyong and surrounds.

This work will protect CHW's water main and support environmental improvements. The work will create one accessible track (for emergency vehicles). The surrounding area will be rehabilitated.

You may notice machinery and temporary fences placed at the site. Traffic, noise and dust will be kept to a minimum. Post works, bollards and temporary fencing will be in place to protect the works and pipeline.

The work will involve rebuilding and securing the creek embankment and filling in deep holes along the easement.

These works are supported by the Woowookarung Strategic Directions Plan 2018 (available at www.parks.vic.gov.au/places-to-see/parks/woowookarung-regional-park). The Plan has a specific goal (8D - 2) regarding this license area: In conjunction with Central Highlands Water, undertake significant rehabilitation of the existing water easement (adjacent to Olympic Avenue) where there is extensive erosion and damage caused by illegal vehicle access, as well as weed infestations.⁴

Parks Victoria will be seeking feedback on Thursday 8 April 2021 (between 4:00 pm and 5:30 pm at the park entrance on Greenhill Avenue) from locals who see this extended area as a place they access nature frequently to understand which trails are important for their local neighbourhood trail experience. This process will include consideration of where trails are dangerous or intersect with important flora or provide habitat for the parks' fauna.

Duly noted by local real estate watchers. A price of \$4.5m was quoted by the agent after an enquiry was made.

The rifle range was last on the market a couple of years ago for \$2.5m.

The Rifle Range is owned by Rifle Range Developments Pty Ltd.

The FoCC imagined that the eastern end of the rifle range would make a welcome addition to the Woowookarung Regional Park. We recognise that any progress would entail significant planning detail and discussions with the owner, local and state government agencies.

8. Parliamentary Inquiry into Ecosystem Decline

The current Victorian Parliamentary "Inquiry into Ecosystem Decline" is underway on line in Melbourne. The inquiry is charged with inquiring into:

"...the decline of Victoria's ecosystems and measures to restore habitats and populations of threatened and endangered species including..."

The inquiry received 946 submissions, some from Ballarat involving the Woowookarung Regional Park and the Yarrowee/Barwon river system. The inquiry began on December 3rd and more sessions are yet to come.

The report is to be completed and given to Government by September 30th 2021.

Then, Friends will be looking carefully at the report, in particular, items of interest to Ballarat such as Koalas and Powerful Owls. This will be an opportunity for friends to raise issues they want with local MP's so as to influence the Governments response. The Government is required to provide a response within six months of receiving the report.

More to come once the report is released!


10. Pennyweight Gully walking and cycle trail.

The Pennyweight Gully trail is the sister trail to Grasstree Creek Trail.

The trail starts at the Grasstree Creek bridge on the old Bunny Rail line adjacent to Rodier St Canadian.

The east end is at the intersection of Boundary Road and Clay Rd Canadian.

The track follows Pennyweight Gully as far as Richards St then follows the south side of Pax Hill and Pennyweight Gully along established trails through the forested area in the Park. Distance 3.19 Kilometres.
